CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

The *International Society for Hip Arthroscopy 2009 Annual Scientific Meeting* wishes to announce a *Call for Abstracts* for paper presentations at its upcoming continuing medical education activity, to be held October 9-10, 2009 at Hospital for Special Surgery, New York, NY. The distinguished faculty represents the leading thinkers in the field today.

Eligibility

There are two categories for which you may be eligible to submit an abstract:

Category I: ISHA Member or Non-Member Research Paper Presentations

We invite all conference participants to submit abstracts for presentation. You must register for the conference and pay a registration fee. Fifteen abstracts will be selected and presented by the principal authors on Friday, October 9, 2009 from 2:30pm-5:30pm. **Submission deadline is Friday, July 6, 2009.**

Category II: ISHA 2009 Resident and Fellow Trainee Paper Session

We invite residents and fellows currently in training who will be attending the conference to submit abstracts to be presented during the ISHA conference, in competition for the ISHA 2009 Trainee Presentation Prize. Ten abstracts will be selected for presentation on Saturday, October 10, 2009 from 10:00am-12:20am. If shortlisted, you must register for the conference, but you will be eligible for the trainee registration fee of \$400 USD. For Category II applicants, a winner will be selected by an ISHA-selected panel for the best presentation at that meeting. The presenter will be prizeed \$1000 USD at the meeting on Saturday, October 10, 2009. **Submission deadline is Friday, July 6, 2009.**

Invited Topics

For Category 1 submissions, we invite abstracts describing current original basic science or applied clinical research related to the following:

- Measurement of outcomes and their relevance to clinical practice
- Evaluation and investigation tools for the patient with early hip disease
- Arthroscopic anatomy of the hip joint and its relevance to safe arthroscopic surgery
- Improvement of post-operative results after arthroscopic femoroacetabular impingement surgery
- The role of hip arthroscopic surgery in the management of articular cartilage damage

For Category 2 submissions (ISHA 2009 Trainee Presentation Prize) all hip arthroscopy related subjects will be considered

Requirements and Guidelines for Submission of Abstracts

The requirements and guidelines for submitting an abstract are as follows:

Category 1 and 2

Abstract proposals may be the result of collaborative research, but the lead author, submitter and presenter must have obtained the permission of all the co-authors to submit and present the work at this meeting.

Written abstract proposals are limited to a maximum of 300 words.

Accepted presentations will be no more than 7 minutes in length.

The same study should not be submitted as multiple abstracts. However, an abstract that is being considered concurrently for presentation at another professional meeting, or for possible publication before the International Society for Hip Arthroscopy 2009 Annual Scientific Meeting, is still eligible.

Any work with human or animal subjects reported in submitted abstracts must comply with the guiding principles for experimental procedures found in the Declaration of Helsinki of the World Medical Association general guidelines. (<http://www.wma.net/e/policy/b3.htm>)

Abstract applicants who are accepted to present must register for the 2009 ISHA Annual Scientific Meeting and pay a registration fee. Residents, trainees and fellows will be eligible to pay the (reduced) trainee registration fee.

Category 2 Additional Criteria

Abstracts selected for presentation in this category will be judged on the following criteria: quality of oratory, time-keeping, quality of audiovisual aids, originality of research presented and question-handling.

Submissions in Category 2 must be accompanied by a letter from the submitter's residency or fellowship program director stating that the applicant is currently enrolled in a formal (accredited or non-accredited) orthopaedic training program on the day of the presentation.

Format for Submitting an Abstract Proposal

Proposals must follow this template for submission. Please submit in a Microsoft Word document file only.

Section I: Category (I or II) and Abstract Title

Title should be brief, clearly indicating the nature of the presentation. When entering your title online, use mixed case (**do not use all caps**), and do not put a period at the end of the title.

Example: This is a Properly Formatted Abstract Title

Section II: Principal Author and/or Co-Authors

List the principal and all co-authors by listing the following:

- Name
- Title (attending surgeon, fellow, resident)
- Primary hospital affiliation
- Medical school/university affiliation
- Academic title

Section III: Content

- Statement of purpose
- Methods, materials and analytical procedures used
- Summary of the results in sufficient detail to support conclusion
- Conclusions reached (do not state "results will be discussed")
- Do the results support or encourage a change in the management and/or methods of care in any of the topic areas listed above?

Section IV: Attachments

Attach all tables, graphics and other supporting documents in hard-copy or electronic format (PowerPoint or Word) to your abstract proposal.

Use of Product Names

The non-proprietary (generic/scientific) name can be used in your abstract(s). The proprietary drug name may appear once in parentheses in the title only. However, if a drug or device has not received FDA approval, only the non-proprietary name may be used in the title and abstract. Failure to follow this rule will result in disqualification of your submission.

Abbreviations

Use standard abbreviations. Place special or unusual abbreviations in parentheses after the first time the full word appears. Do not abbreviate compounds in the title of the abstract. Use numerals to indicate numbers, except when beginning sentences.

Abstract Selection Processes

Abstracts will be reviewed and selected by the Abstract Review Committee by **Friday, July 31, 2009**. In the event that you are selected, it is your sole responsibility to arrange the necessary set up of your presentation, i.e. bringing of slides, appropriate cables if using a MAC versus PC.

Presentation at Symposium if Selected

Category I--Free Paper Session

This session of the program will be on **Friday, October 9, 2009** from **2:30pm-5:30pm**.

Category II--ISHA 2009 Trainee Paper Session

This session of the program will be on **Saturday, October 10, 2009** from **10:40am-12:20pm**.

Principal Author Responsibilities

At the time of submission, the submitter will be the sole point of contact for information regarding the submission and is responsible for the following:

- Ensuring each co-author is aware of the contents of the abstract and supports its data. Failure to receive approval from each co-author will result in the Abstract being disqualified.
- Ensuring each co-author is aware of the disclosure requirements.
- Forwarding abstract acceptance/rejection notification and Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education ACCME policies to each co-author.
- Notifying each co-author of any changes to the program, as may be corresponded by the conference staff, in a timely manner.

Faculty Disclosure Forms

Anyone presenting an abstract and/or participating as a faculty member at an accredited CME activity sponsored by HSS must complete and sign the enclosed Faculty Disclosure form as required by ACCME Essentials and Standards for Commercial Support. Our policy on Faculty Disclosure is attached for your information. The principal author and all co-authors must sign a Disclosure form. Kindly return the Faculty Disclosure form(s) along with your abstract.

Submission Instructions

In the subject line of your e-mail, please type *International Society for Hip Arthroscopy 2009 Annual Scientific Meeting Session Abstract*. Please make clear whether the submitted abstract is for a Category 1 or Category 2 presentation. *Please also* sign the Faculty Disclosure Form, scan and return in a PDF file format as an attachment along with your abstract.
