OVERVIEW:

Many clinicians, such as orthopaedic surgeons and rehabilitation therapists, are unaware of the proper treatment and management techniques for ankle injuries common among athletes. Through didactic lectures, case presentations, and question and answer sessions, this Sports Injuries webinar will cover topics including management of ankle fractures, cartilage lesions within the ankle, Achilles injuries, and ankle instability.
