Overview

The field of musculoskeletal medicine is highly dynamic and rapidly changing. Research findings result in new techniques and clinical guidelines such as revised

treatment options for patients who suffer from chronic osteomyelitis, and positive and negative effects of the use of bisphosphonate in patients with osteogenesis imperfecta. Orthopaedic surgeons and clinicians are expected to keep abreast of these advances in order to achieve optimal clinical practice and patient care.

The Visiting Professor Lecture Series is designed to augment both the basic science and applied clinical practice knowledge and competence of our attending physicians. Information presented in these lectures focuses on both musculoskeletal research and related clinical science perspectives.
