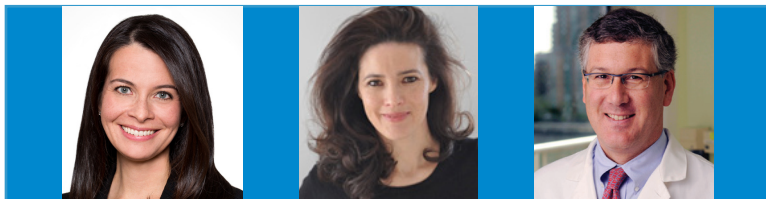

- Partner with HSS staff on key projects as needed
