Support is a Phone Call Away

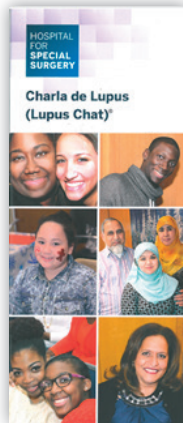
